MORTGAGE BROKER ACCREDITATION

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

Question	Answer
When and how will the new Mortgage Education and Accreditation Standards (MEAS) be implemented?	Implementation will begin in 2017. Each Regulator will identify a timeline that works with their jurisdiction. All Regulators have committed to implementing the standards by 2020.
How long do Course Providers have to comply?	Implementation will begin in 2017. Each Regulator will identify a timeline that works with their jurisdiction. There will be an adjustment period during which time Course Providers will be able to learn about the standards and update their courses accordingly. Regulators have committed to implementing the standards by 2020.
What is the process for submitting a course for review and accreditation?	Each Regulator will have an established process for submitting courses for approval. Please visit the Regulator website in your jurisdiction for more information.
We're in a small jurisdiction, how do these standards apply to our jurisdiction?	All the standards that relate to Infrastructure, Course Administration, Curriculum/Courses and Course Results apply to jurisdictions of all sizes. Some standards that relate to Course Exams may be more difficult for small jurisdictions to implement. Where there is a need for independent reviewers, smaller jurisdictions may consider working together to review each other's questions.
What resources are available to review courses for accreditation?	There are several resources available. What is the expected timeline from submitting a course to a decision on whether or not it is accredited?	Each Regulator will have an established process for submitting courses for approval. This will include the timeline from submitting a course to an accreditation. Please visit the Regulator website in your jurisdiction for more information.
What happens if a course doesn't meet standards?	All Regulators will provide a letter indicating if a course meets the standards or not. The letter may indicate the course is approved and therefore accredited. The letter may indicate a course is approved upon certain conditions. Or, the letter may indicate the course is not approved and provide an explanation.
